**Circular letter to**

**all companies having registered their ships under the flag of Antigua and Barbuda W.I.;**  
**all ships registered under the flag of Antigua and Barbuda W.I.;**  
**all Maritime Authorities involved in Maritime Control- and Compliance Measures**

1. The IMO Assembly (A 22, November 2001) unanimously adopted Resolution A. 924(22) on measures and procedures to prevent acts of terrorism which threaten the security of passengers and crews and the safety of ships.
2. IMO Res.A.924(22) encouraged governments, in its fourth operative paragraph, to put in place and vigorously implement appropriate security measures around and in port areas and terminals, including offshore terminals and on board ships flying their flag.
3. As a result, Antigua and Barbuda has reviewed its existing national maritime legislation and has put in place appropriate Maritime Security Regulations made by the Minister under part VI, chapter 1-5 of the MSA 2006, as amended.
